## **EXAMINATION OF THE EYE**

## <u>Key skills</u>

## Examination routine:

1. Visual acuity	Use Snellen chart at 6 metres Test each eye separately Allow use of glasses if normally worn Normal vision is "6/6" <i>Terminology: A reading of "left eye 6/60" means that the</i> <i>patient can only read the top line with the left eye.</i>
2. Pupils	Size Light reflex (direct & consensual) Accommodation
3. Eye movements	III, IV, VI Which nerve supplies which muscle?
<ul><li>4. Visual fields</li><li>5. Fundoscopy</li></ul>	These skills are covered in a separate workshop but remember that they apply to many eye problems.
6. Direct assessment	Inflammation Discharge Foreign bodies
7. Subtarsal examination	Evert upper lid with a cotton bud whilst patient looks down.
8. Slit lamp assessment Use of local anaesthesia	Conjunctiva Cornea Anterior chamber
Use of fluorescein	Corneal abnormalities seen under a blue light
